February

February 10th- Venice Rookery wading bird rookery

February 24th- Freedom Park and Gordon River Greenway

Freedom Park is located on the north side of Golden Gate Parkway, just east of Goodlette-Frank Road. Meet at 8:00 AM. For those that want to stroll through the Gordon River Greenway, meet in the parking lot at 8:00 AM. March

Option 1-- March 24th- Wakodahatchee Wetlands (Option 1 and 2 to be determined by March 8th DPI-SIG mtg.)

Option 2-- March 24th- Florida Panther National Wildlife Refuge (Option 1 and 2 to be determined by the March 8th DPI-SIG mtg., depending on habitat conditions)

Drive on your own or meet at the Cracker Barrel at 7:00 AM to carpool. Arrival to the Refuge Administration Office at 7:30 AM (State Road 29, 1.5 mile north of Interstate 75). The Refuge is planning on a number of prescribed fires along State Road 29 that will produce abundant wild flowers and opportunities to photograph wildlife and landscapes. April

Option 1-- April 21- Marsh Trail, Ten Thousand Islands National Wildlife Refuge (Option 1 and 2, to be determined by the April 12th DPI-SIG mtg.)

Drive on your own or arrange carpooling on your own. The Marsh Trail parking lot is located about three miles east of Collier-Seminole State Park and County Road 92. Getting there from I-75 in Naples, take exit 101. Then follow Collier Blvd south to its junction with U.S. 41. Turn left. The Marsh Trail access area is 11 miles east along U.S. 41. Turnoffs for Goodland and Collier-Seminole State Park will be passed before you reach the parking area near mile marker 31. Marsh trail provides opportunities to photograph all sorts of birds, particularly wading birds from the trail or observation tower. Alligators are present and at least one crocodile was frequently observed in 2017. More info at https://www.fws.gov/refuge/Florida_Panther/about.html

Option 2-- April 21th- Florida Panther National Wildlife Refuge (Option 1 and 2, to be determined by the April 12th DPI-SIG mtg., depending on habitat conditions)

Drive on your own or meet at the Cracker Barrel at 7:00 AM to carpool. Arrival to the Refuge Administration Office at 7:30 AM (State Road 29, 1.5 mile north of Interstate 75). The Refuge is planning on a number of prescribed fires along State Road 29 that will produce abundant wild flowers and opportunities to photograph wildlife and landscapes. July

July 14th- Sunset Time Lapse Shoot at the Beach

Join Jim Robellard at the beach, on the north side of the pier, for a short course in time-lapse photography as the sun sets over the Gulf. Sunset is at 8:21 PM. Please arrive by 7:30 PM. Bring your tripod, drinking water, bug spray and rubber duckie.

July 14th- Morning light at the Garden of Hope

Join us at the Naples Community Hospital's Garden of Hope. Meet in the garden at 8:00 AM, located on the south side of the hospital. The garden is beautifully landscaped with a pond and several statues.

August

August 14th (Tuesday)- The Naples Botanical Garden

Meet in front of the Garden entrance at 7:45 AM, and enter at 8:00 AM, when it opens. Certainly, flowers are everywhere to photograph, but also butterflies and birds. September 5th- Naples Pier Photo Mob

December 8th- Naples Pier Photo Mob (makeup date if the September date washes out)

Plan to arrive and set up by 5:00 PM, on the beach on the north side of the pier. Sunset is at 6:58 PM. There is a 2% crescent moon which will set at 6:58 PM. At which time the sky should sufficiently reveal the stars. The Naples Pier re-build is supposed to be completed by August and the entire pier will be open to the public. This will be a very orchestrated night "shoot," whereby participants will be divided into two teams. While Team 1 is positioned on the beach with cameras on tripods, Team 2 will be divided into sub-groups, using a variety of lighting (lasers, flashes, flashlights, etc.) to apply during the camera exposure. The idea is to expose the pier in a way it has never been seen. There will be no moon on this night, so the stars (hopefully no clouds) should make a beautiful backdrop. Plans will be handed out at the August DPI-SIG meeting.

December 15th- Eagle Lakes Park, Naples

Meet at the parking lot at 8:00 AM, when it opens (Located along Tamiami Trail at 11565 Tamiami Tr. E., Naples, FL 34112. Primarily a birding shoot, so longer lenses are recommended.
